# **Geography Scheme of Learning Year 8 – Term 2/Unit 2/ Asia – Challenges and Opportunities**

#### Intent - Rationale

Asia's history, vast population, range of physical features and cultural diversity make it a fascinating area of study. We intend to impart knowledge of Asia's physical features and biomes. With a focus on China, students develop knowledge of the environmental challenges and opportunities of rapid economic growth as well as question the ethical issues of the One Child Policy. The impact of urbanisation and the changes in Tibet are taught through the study of the Physical and Human Geography of Southwest China.

Do you agree?</li> <li>Summative assessments: multiple-choice, one-mark answers, extended answers in test or exam conditions as end-of-unit tests</li> <li>Key word meaning and spelling tests are included as part of the focus on building a knowledge bank of geographical vocabulary.</li> </ul>
